COME NOW Plaintiffs St. Louis County, Missouri and Charlie A. Dooley, and ask that summary judgment be ordered in their favor. As grounds therefor, Plaintiffs state that:

The Statement of Material Facts Not In Issue (attached hereto in compliance with Rule 74.04(c)(1)) requires the conclusion that Section 571.101 R.S.Mo. (Supp. 2003) operates with regard to St. Louis County as an unfunded mandate in violation of the Missouri Constitution, Article X, Sections 16 and 21. Further, the fee authorized by such statute does not operate to reimburse St. Louis County for the costs of processing applications for a concealed carry endorsement.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated above, summary judgment in favor of Plaintiffs is appropriate, and Plaintiffs ask that summary judgment be ordered in their favor, and for such other relief as the Court deems appropriate in the circumstances, including an order that St. Louis County not be required to comport with the provisions of the statute relating to processing applications for and issuing concealed carry endorsements.
